The modern auditorium seats 1,028 and is the ideal place to kick off the convention with an opening speech and several lectures. Many more colleagues worldwide are watching the two-hour opening on the Internet via live streaming.

While Mr. A. and his colleagues are having lunch together, the seating in the auditorium is quickly changed to accommodate the



international symposium that is taking place in parallel. They opted for nearly 500 comfortable desks and chairs arranged in parliamentary style.

Ms. B. is loving it. Her hotel is just off the Königsallee, the highest revenue-generating shopping street in all of Germany.

After Ms. B. has relaxed in one of the many cafés along the Rhine promenade, she takes a leisurely stroll through the historic Old Town, taking note of inviting restaurants, bars, boutiques, and galleries.



Ms. B. is passionate about art and culture, and doesn't miss the opportunity to visit a few of Düsseldorf's museums and galleries after her walk through the Old Town.



She starts with the modern classics in the "K20" museum.

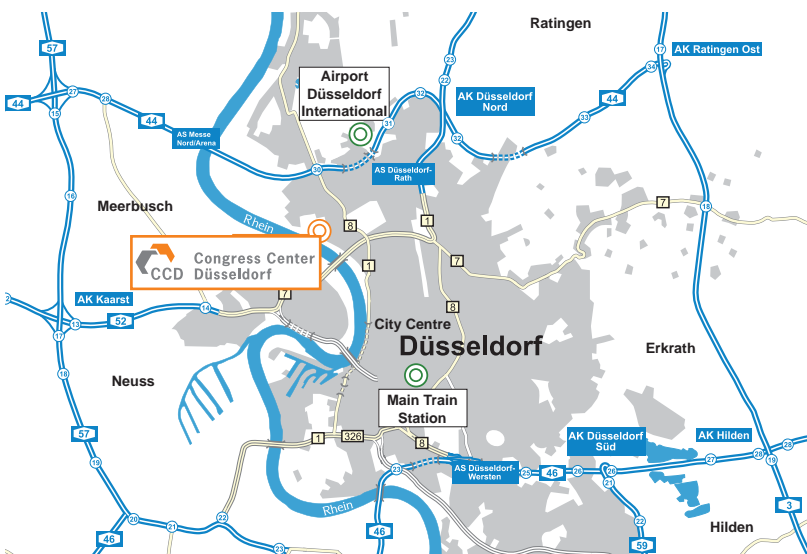

Around 190 high-speed ICE trains and 800 regional trains stop in Düsseldorf every day, connecting you directly with an extensive underground and bus system that bring you to your destination fast.

Excellent highway infrastructure

A comprehensive network of highways and 19,000 parking spots on the well-connected fairground make driving to Düsseldorf a snap.

There are lots of reasons why Düsseldorf has been rated among the top five cities in the world in terms of quality of life **:



Fine arts: Düsseldorf is a hot spot for modern art in Germany, boasting an acclaimed art academy (Kunstakademie), top museums, and over 100 significant galleries. It is also home to the Deutsche Oper am Rhein, as well as numerous theatres and cabaret stages.



Culture: Attractive gardens, parks, and other green spaces earned the city first prize in the European Entente Florale competition in 2007 and 2008. Its historic jewels range from Schloss Benrath, the best preserved late Baroque castle and garden grounds in Europe, to the ruins of the medieval Imperial Palace (Kaiserpfalz) on the Rhine.



Sports and architecture: Düsseldorf hosts world-class sporting events, such as ice hockey, horse racing, the FIS World Cup cross-country skiing event along the banks of the Rhine, and the ARAG WORLD TEAM CUP men's doubles tennis world championship. Düsseldorf's architecturally (and gastronomically!) unique media harbor attracts architecture buffs from across the world.



Multicultural flair: Nearly 20% of Düsseldorf's population is foreign and nearly 8,000 Japanese residents form the largest Japanese population in Germany, giving Düsseldorf a distinctly international atmosphere. But Düsseldorf also maintains good old German traditions, such as the unique Carnival on the Rhine.

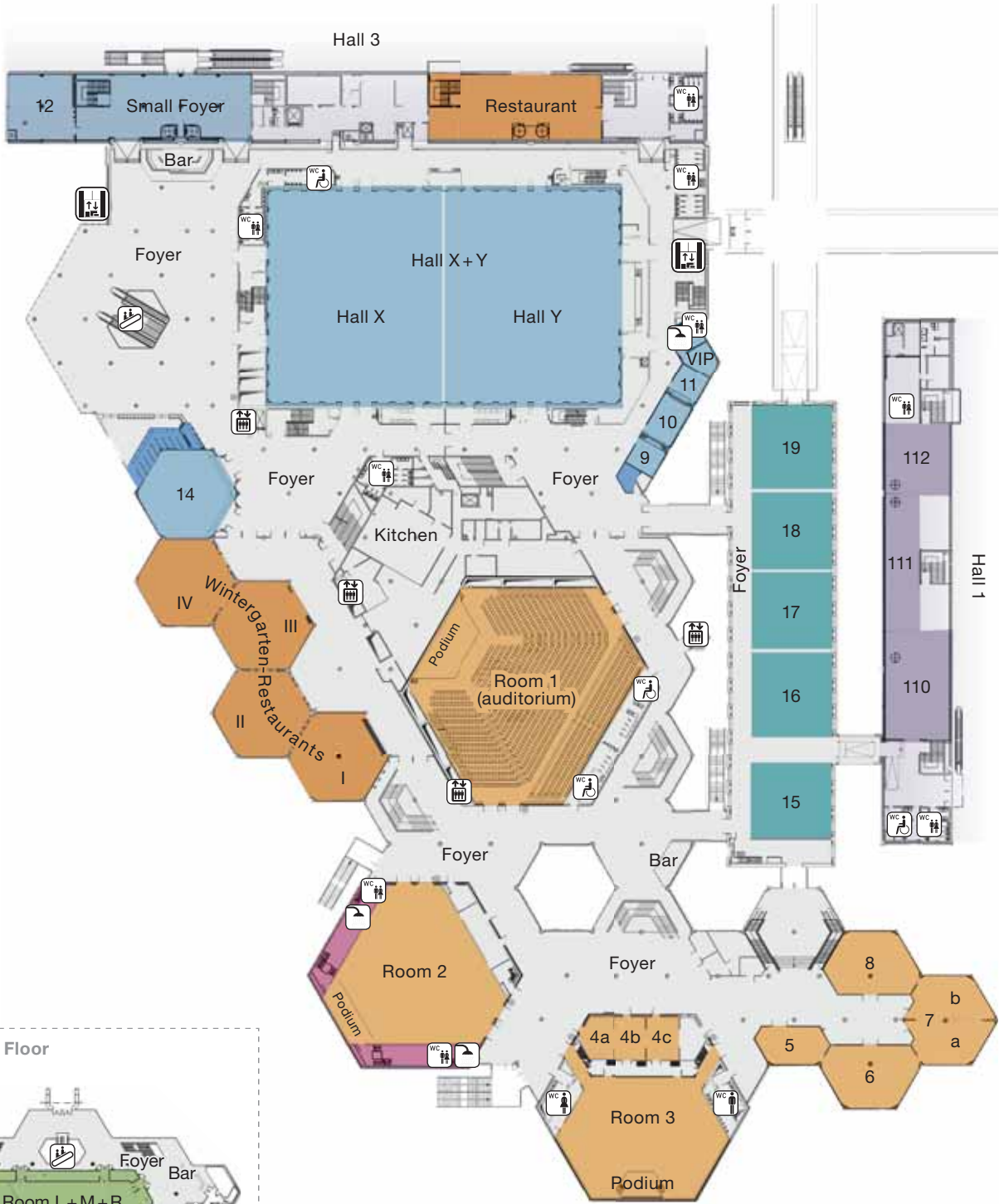

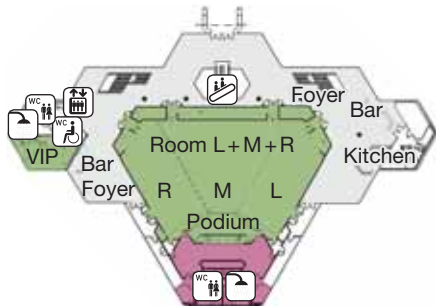
